As you gain more experience you'll see a larger variety of assessment tools beyond observation and demonstration through tasks.</p> <p>Additionally, classroom management and keeping learners on task is a skill that will grow as you continue to learn more strategies for your toolbox.</p>

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<b>Suggestions for Improvement:</b>	<p>Remember that you are a pre-professional (almost) teacher. Take advantage of the expertise in the classroom and engage with the cooperating teacher as much as you should be engaging with the students. They know their students inside and out. You seem to be a bit shy, but pick their brains! Ask them about what is going to work and what isn't or for feedback on lesson plans or about the ins and outs of teaching.</p> <p>This practicum is a bit different because of the limited time you have in the rooms. I think you did a nice job of being present in the moment, but moving forward, break out of your shell a bit and have purposeful conversation with the teachers. They have a lot to teach you also, but sometimes you need to ask the questions to get them going.</p>
