Auditory

- What is it?
 - Learn by hearing and listening
 - Remember and tend to understand things you have heard better
 - Learn by reading out loud
- Possible Qualities
 - You might talk to yourself or hum if you feel bored.
 - You remember instructions better when they are spoken to you.

Visual

- What is it?
 - Learn by seeing pictures and reading
 - Remember and tend to understand things you have seen
 - Like to see what you are learning
- Possible Qualities
 - You close your eyes to recall things.
 - You watch something when you are bored.
 - You prefer when a teacher gives you written



Tactile (Kinesthetic)



- What is it?
 - Learn by doing or touching
 - Remember things through physical movement
 - "hands-on" learner, need frequent breaks and be active
- Possible Qualities
 - You often use your hands when you are having a conversation.
 - You like to take things apart and fix them.
 - You find reasons to move and tinker.

Study Tips Based on Learning Style

Auditory

- Make sure you sit where you can hear clearly.
 - Make flashcards and study them by reading out loud.
 - Read directions, books, and work out loud.
 - Record yourself studying out loud then listen to your recording.
 - Study new material by reading it out loud.
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Visual

- Sit where you can see clearly, probably the front of the classroom.
 - Visualize what you hear in class or what you are reading.
 - Write down key words, ideas, or instructions.
 - Draw pictures of what you are studying to help you remember content.
 - Try to color code you notes and work material.

















- Try to do as many hands-on activities as possible, art projects, acting, walking.
- Chew gum or sit in a rocking chair while studying.
- Use flashcards a game of memory so you can physically match the cards.

<p style="text-align: center;"><u><i>Musical</i></u></p> <p>Need: music playing at home & school, musical instruments Love: singing, humming, whistling, tapping feet, listening</p>		
<p style="text-align: center;"><u><i>Logical-Mathematical</i></u></p> <p>Need: things to explore & think about, science materials, manipulatives Love: experimenting, questioning, puzzles, calculating</p>		
<p style="text-align: center;"><u><i>Intrapersonal</i></u></p> <p>Need: secret places, alone time, self-paced projects, choices Love: setting goals, meditating, dreaming, being quiet</p>		
<p style="text-align: center;"><u><i>Naturalistic</i></u></p> <p>Need: field trips, outside lessons, time outside Love: plants and animals, spending time outdoors</p>
